COTTESLOE

Influenced by a mixture of mid-century design aesthetics and the use of sustainable principles, this garden makes practical use of minimal space.

The owners of the home wanted a garden that would require minimal maintenance and provide them with adequate interesting spaces for frequent entertainment. They also requested a small kitchen garden with herbs, as well as citrus and olive trees, and artistic elements in both the private and public spaces within the garden.

There was to be a cohesive use of the key elements and textures throughout, with the spaces designed to be useable in all seasons. The strategic placement of a deciduous tree in the rear courtyard provides additional greenery, while a louvred pergola allows precious winter light to penetrate throughout the house and garden. Beautiful hand-textured, curved raised garden beds serve as a place to sit as well as being filled with delicious herbs and Tahitian lime, lemon and orange trees, all just a few steps from the kitchen door. All of these components have combined to create a thoughtful balance of practicality and aesthetics within this garden.
